## Pronouns

### Focus

- A **subject pronoun** replaces one or more nouns in the subject. *I, you, he, she, it, we, and they* are subject pronouns.

The kids organized a yard sale. **They** organized a yard sale. Salena ran to first base. **She** ran to first base.

- An **object pronoun** replaces one or more nouns in the predicate. *Me, you, her, him, it, us, and them* are object pronouns.

Ishiko came with **me** to the concert. Uncle Tito played with **them**. I gave **her** my notes. Mr. Fox is looking for **you**.

- A **possessive pronoun** shows ownership. *My, your, her, his, our, your, its* and *their* are used with nouns. *Mine, yours, hers, his, its, ours, yours, and theirs* are used alone.

**Your** sister scored a goal. Therese can have **mine**. This last slice of pie is **yours**.
