## Focus

- A prefix changes the meaning of the base or root word it comes before. The prefix **inter-** means “among” or “between.”
- A suffix is a word part that is added to the end of a base or root word. The suffix **-ly** changes an adjective to an adverb. If the word ends in *y*, change it to *i* before adding **-ly**.
- The suffix **-sion** means “the state or quality of.” It is added to verbs to make them nouns.
